This year, in recognition of his many contributions and leadership, the Mining Association of B.C. is pleased to honour the late Terry Mulligan.

Terry was a steadfast supporter of a strong and growing mining industry and a firm believer in giving back. As the President and CEO of the Mining Suppliers Association of B.C. (MSABC) for 22 years, Terry saw the industry through numerous cycles. A leader who was able to encourage participation and mobilize action, Terry was dedicated to building a strong and prosperous mining industry that generated jobs for all regions of the province.

Terry was also a driving force behind many of the industry's charitable causes. A long-time supporter of Mining for Miracles, MineralsEd, BC Mining Week and the Britannia Mine Museum, Terry was a leader and an advocate for giving back and raising awareness about the importance of a thriving mining industry.
